The Club benefits from a fantastic site on Chidden Down, just outside Petersfield. The site has outstanding views over to the Isle of Wight and to the North of Hampshire. The main club flying session is on Sunday morning from 10 a.m. although there is unrestricted flying for members seven days a week.



If you are thinking of taking up a new hobby the club has two in-house examiners both of whom, along with two or three other nominated members, will help you learn the ins and outs of flying. Or if you are just returning after a long break, come along on a Sunday morning to have a look around and meet some of the members up at the patch.
